1. Open Space, Sport and Recreation Studies

- Lancaster District PPG17 Study (2007, refreshed 2010)
 - Analysed existing provision and identified need
 - Downloadable from the LGS website
 - Evidence base for other strategies so it has 'planning weight'.

Considers: Cemeteries, Parks & Gardens, Outdoor Sports facilities, Allotments, Natural and Semi Natural Greenspace, Facilities for Children & Young People and Amenity Greenspace.

- Helen Ryan maintains a database of some 700 greenspace sites using this classification. They are also mapped on the City Council's GIS (Geographical Information System)
 - A small number of user and resident surveys have been done in the parks by greenspace groups and the City Council. Contact: haveyoursay@lancaster.gov.uk
 - There are County and City Play Strategies in existence but do they have any weight now? There is a National Play Strategy see www.playengland.org.uk


2. Local Green Space designation

A way to provide special protection for green areas of <u>particular importance</u> to communities.

- Must not be extensive
- Must not already have planning permission
- Must be close to the community it serves
- Must be demonstrably special
- Will be incorporated in our Local Plan
- Not too late to suggest areas!
- Can also be part of Neighbourhood Plans

Report commissioned 2012 in two parts - on LGS website



4. The Local Plan

Made up of a bundle of documents:

- Core Strategy
- Development Management Plan = policies
- Land Allocations = map of what uses are allowed where
- Morecambe Area Action Plan = actions to support regeneration
- Arnside and Silverdale AONB Plan = extra landscape protection
- Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Plan
- Supplementary Planning Documents (SPDs)
 e.g. shopfront and advertising, Employment and skills plans

5. City Council Corporate Plan 2015-2018 Four Priority Areas

- 1. Clean, Green and Safe Places
- 2. Health and Wellbeing
- 3. Community Leadership
- 4. Sustainable Economic Growth

Outcomes include:

1. Local neighbourhoods are clean and safe and residents have a sense of pride in the district.

Success measures include:

- Perception of people who live in, work in, or visit the district that streets and public spaces are safe and clean is increased
- Increased number of projects that directly involve local communities in improving local areas, parks and open spaces
